Illinois Name Changes

735 ILCS 5/21-101

Common law name changes not allowed

- "Common law" name change is to simply begin using your chosen name and assume it
- Common law name changes adopted in this State on or after July 1, 2010 are invalid.
- All name changes shall be made pursuant to marriage, divorce, or other legal proceedings.



Petitioner Requirements

- Current Resident of Illinois
- Resided in Illinois for 6 months
 - Can combine residences
- File a petition in circuit court of the county of residency
 - Champaign County Courthouse
 - Urbana, Illinois





Current Prohibitions (Expire Dec. 31, 2023)



 Unless 10 years have passed since completion and discharge from the sentence


Identity Theft Convictions

Not allowed to petition for name change

Sex Crimes Convictions

- Not allowed to petition for name change
- Criminal sexual abuse when the victim of the offense at the time of its commission is under 18 years of age
- Felony or misdemeanor sexual exploitation of a child
- Felony or misdemeanor indecent solicitation of a child
- Felony or misdemeanor indecent solicitation of an adult
- Any offense requiring registration under the Sex Offender Registration Act





Affidavit in Support

- Name Change Petition must be verified by the affidavit of some credible person
- Can be friend, family member....etc





Notice by Publication

Publication by Newspaper

- Notice shall be published for 3 consecutive weeks after filing
- First publication must be at least 6 weeks before the petition hearing
- Publication with News-Gazette currently \$76


Waiver-Discrimination or Physical Harm

- You make a motion to the court requesting that publishing be waived because you believe publishing would put you at risk of physical harm or discrimination..
- Must provide evidence to support the claim that publishing notice of the name change would put the person at risk of physical harm or discrimination.


Public Act 102-1133

Signed into law February 10, 2023

Effective January 1, 2024







Easing of Offender Registration Restrictions


- Name changes allowable even if required to register under:
 - Sex Offender Registration Act
 - Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Registration Act
 - Arsonist Registration Act
- Name change must be due to:
 - Status as a victim of trafficking
 - Gender-related identity
 - Defined by the Illinois Human Rights Act
 - Marriage
 - Religious beliefs
- Court has discretion to deny these petitions





Person must wait until sentence has been completed, terminated, or discharged before filing a name change petition

Objections to Petition

State's Attorney objections to the petition shall be served upon the petitioner








Publication Waiver

Allowed for Hardship

Including a negative impact on the person's health or safety

- Waiver is presumed granted
- Waiver request is heard at the petition hearing
- Court has discretion to determine hardship
- May order the petitioner to publish







- Affidavit in Support no longer required
- Petitions to be filed on Statewide Approved Forms







Policy Points


Allows people to have identity documents that align with their authentic selves

> Removes lifetime bans for certain convictions



Limitations

Identifying Documents

-Signed Order does not change name on any identifying documents:

- Driver's License/State ID
- Passport
- Social Security Card
- Birth Certificate

Changing Documents

- -Administrative Process
- -Varies State by State
- -Lawyer not required
- -Gender Marker not implicated
